FROM YOUR MINISTER

Dear Friends,

When I was called to the Unitarian Universalist Church of Stockton in May of 2010, I committed to the Search Committee and the Board that I would stay at least five years and no longer than eight. I made the commitment of five years because I felt strongly that the congregation needed a consistent ministerial presence for the period of healing and growth we were entering at the beginning of this decade. I limited the time of my service to eight years because I believe that no ministry can be successful if one person, however dedicated, leads in one community for too long. I have been open and upfront about this commitment from the beginning of my time here and have done my best to prepare the congregation for its future beyond my ministry.

This September marks the beginning of my sixth year as your minister, making me the third longest-serving minister in the church's 115 year history. Sadly, this will also be my last year as minister of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Stockton: I will be entering search for a new position and will be ending my service here next June. My last service will appropriately be Fathers' Day, Sunday, June 19th, 2016.

I want everyone to know that I do not make this decision lightly, nor do I lament my decision to stay this long. It is also with great ambivalence and grief that I and my family will move on from this community; all of you who have been part of this church the last five years have been an incredible blessing to us and our lives.

Because of this transition, everyone who is invested in this church and its future will need to be especially engaged in our work together: participating in congregational meetings and self-reflection activities, volunteering for our religious education program and special services. I am especially glad that the Board has decided to pursue the Soul Matters program for this year, as the small-group discussions will ultimately support and inform our work going forward.

I will be working with volunteers to transition some of the administrative functions I've been performing, such as website and Facebook administration, newsletter construction and production, and membership processes. If you are interested and able to help out in any of these areas, please contact me as soon as possible.

We will also be re-envisioning our Care Team and the way members may take on some of the ever-important work of connecting with those in our community who need physical and emotional support.

Please understand how much I love this congregation and all the wonderful folks who make it up. Some of the interactions I've had with you have been painful, but the vast majority have been glorious and provided a deepening for my own belief in the power of our shared, saving faith. I consider myself incredibly blessed to have been called to walk with this congregation and its members, helping consecrate weddings, dedicate children in our faith (including my own), and mourning while celebrating lives which have passed.

Finally, please remember that ministers come and go, but it is you the members who make the congregation. Though I have been incredibly fortunate to serve here, it has never been my church. It has always been and continues to be yours. I look forward to our final year together and offer you many blessings for the time ahead.

NEWS FROM YOUR BOARD

Before the August Board meeting, Rev. Erik Carlson informed the board that he would be entering search for a new congregation. Erik has been a steady and valuable minister to our congregation for the past five years and will have completed six years next summer.

We appreciate that Erik told us in advance about his decision, which gives us time to form a committee to lead the congregation in the process of searching for a new minister. At the August board meeting, the board discussed potential church members to lead the congregation in this transition. The tentative committee to be voted on and approved at the September Board meeting is Randy Downing, Alice Erickson, Mark Haman, Rich Mattas, and Nancy Schuldt.

The co-moderators and Alice Erickson met with Rev. Dr. Matthew Johnson, the senior minister of the UU Church in Rockford to determine the best course of action to take going forward. The landscape has changed dramatically since Rev.

Erik was called in 2010. There are many congregations searching and too few ministers to fill the vacancies. The chance of getting a settled, full-time minister is slim given our small congregation and limited financial package.

We could be looking at a part-time minister or shared ministry with another congregation. Ultimately, it's up to the congregation to determine the direction we should take to keep the pulpit filled and continue pastoral care.

One of the first duties the Transition Team will complete is to develop a Congregational survey that will give the team direction. All members and friends of the UU Church of Stockton will receive a survey and we cannot emphasize enough the importance of filling it out and returning it. In the 116 years that we have existed here in Northwest Illinois, we have overcome many obstacles. The dedication and commitment of our members and friends has sustained this congregation in the past and will continue to long into the future.

Rev. Erik has helped us transition to the 21st century with new technology that will help immensely in attracting a new minister and providing meaningful services. If you have questions feel free to call Mark or Ted and please fill out and return the survey after you receive it in September.

SOUL MATTERS – SEPTEMBER 2015 - INVITATION

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A PEOPLE OF INVITATION?



Do not try to save the whole world or do anything grandiose. Instead, create a clearing in the dense forest of your life and wait there patiently, until the song that is your life falls into your own cupped hands and you recognize and greet it. Only then will you know how to give yourself to this world so worthy of rescue.

Create a clearing, listen for your song and let it teach you how to give yourself to this world. There is no better description of the religious life than this! And notice that it all begins with invitation, with the deep humility and knowledge that while the song is deeply ours, it also comes from something or somewhere beyond ourselves. It takes time, but eventually we each come to realize that --to be whole and to find home-- a space must be made, a clearing must be created, and otherness must be invited in.

EXPERIENCE THE THEME THIS MONTH — CHOOSE ONE OR MORE:

SESSION PLAN

CHALICE LIGHTING

This being human is a guest house.

GENERAL CHECK-IN

Question: Introduce yourself (name, work, family) and then answer:
What new things have entered your life, invited or not, over this summer?

BEING A GROUP

Discuss and reach agreement about time and place, expectations of attendance (including letting the facilitator know if you can't come), confidentiality (what is said here stays here, encouragement to reach minister if needed), and general group dynamics (“step up/step back”, respect for diversity/each person, active listening). Ask “what do you need to feel safe in this group?”

EXPERIENCE

Share your experience (“Invitation” poem and/or inviting someone to church). What did you discover? After sharing, discussion.

CONVERSATION

Identify a question that “grabs” you and provide a short answer. After sharing, discussion.

1. Is there enough silence, stillness and space in your life to hear “the invitation”?
2. Are you open to the invitation of the divine?
3. In her song, “May I Suggest,” Susan Werner sings, “May I suggest this is the best part of your life...” What if that were true for you? What would it mean for you to accept the invitation that right now is the best and most blessed time of your life?
4. How are you handling Life’s invitation to live gracefully and even gratefully with uncertainty and change?
5. When were you “the stranger” and someone invited you in? More importantly, how are you re-paying that gift in your present day living and loving?
6. What are you doing with the invitation to love yourself?

CHECK-OUT

What's your take-away about “invitation?” Your gratitude for this time?




